## Meet with police personnel Tuesday

Residents can meet with local law-enforcement officials Tuesday during a forum at a city church.

## Flu vaccine clinics for seniors continue

Personnel with the Orange Nursing Division will conduct the city's annual flu and pneumonia vaccination clinics for senior residents.

Three sessions are scheduled before the end of October:

- Today: Oakwood Towers, 400 Oakwood Ave., 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

- Oct. 14: New Community Senior Citizens Center, 132 William St., 1 to 4 p.m.

- Oct. 28: Orange City Hall, 29 N. Day St., 8:30 a.m. to noon.

Residents must be at least 65 years of age to be eligible. Those on Medicare are urged to bring their traditional Medicare card. Individuals with Medicare Advantage plans will have co-payments. No Medicaid plans will be accepted.
