New Crime TipLine in Orange lets residents make the call to say something when they see something

Orange NJ - In a partnership effort with residents to aggressively fight crime on every front, Mayor Dwayne D. Warren, Esq. and the Orange Police Department have launched the Orange TipLine. The TipLine gives residents the ability to anonymously report information about crimes and activities that adversely affect the overall quality of life in Orange to local law enforcement.

Callers can send text messages or photos via their smartphone to the police. While all calls to the TipLine will be kept confidential, the Orange Police Department will call tipsters who wish to get a status update of any investigation based on the information police receive through the TipLine. Residents may also follow up on their crime tips by going to the City website — www.ci.orange.nj.us/tipline.pdf — to check the status of police investigations based on the tips they receive.

Mayor Warren said, “The Orange TipLine is another tool in our arsenal to keep our families safe, by allowing residents to be additional eyes and ears, by helping to root out crime in our community. We must take collective responsibility in keeping our streets safe by identifying and arresting the small group of offenders who threaten our quality of life.

If you have information about a crime or an issue affecting the quality of life in your community, describe the problem, and the location. The TipLine is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Although your call is treated confidentially, you can choose to leave your name and contact information, so that the Orange Police Department can follow up with you regarding your tip. “
